Training: Financial Management of International Projects

In the Implementation Plan of the Grant Agreement no. 2014 / 346-982 are provided the organization of trainings for international project management to streamline the participation in 'Horizon 2020'.

A group of representatives of the Academy of Sciences of Moldova (Economic Policy and Finance Department, Legal Department, Science and Innovation Management, Financing Centre for Fundamental and Applied Research, Expertise Advisory Board, Centre of International Projects), Ministry of Finance and the State Treasury of Moldova participated in the period 16- 20 June 2015 in a training on financial management of international projects, organized by the Regional Centre of Studies of the North-East Regional Development Agency in Piatra Neamt NORTH EAST, Romania. During this period were presented writing projects, administrative and financial management of projects funded by Horizon 2020.

The courses has set to familiarize the participants about the objectives, general methodological steps, information required when is developing a project, proposal and the instruments used in the financial management of the project implementation period.

She shared her experience of monitoring, implementation of activities specified in the financing contracts and ensuring proper management of the financing contracts having extensive experience in developing applications for reimbursement and progress reports related to contracts concluded within international programs.
